

- + To receive the sacrament without coming forward, please notify an usher and be seated near an aisle.



SABBATICAL BLESSING

A *Reading from Genesis:* On the seventh day God finished his work which he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all his work which he had done in creation. (Gen 2:2-3)

A Reading from Exodus: Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. (Ex 20:8)

A Reading from St. Mark: Jesus said to the apostles, "Come away by yourselves to a lonely place, and rest a while." (Mk 6:31)

A Throughout Holy Scripture, from Genesis to Jesus' ministry and the Church's mission, accounts of holy activity are clearly set apart by rest, quiet, and time for restoration. The Lord God has given his people the Sabbath pattern as a time of renewal, a time to be reminded of whose we are, and what we are called to do, a time of rest that refreshes us for life.
