January Prayer of the Week

One of the ways we live out our Christian faith is through a life of prayer. Sometimes, however, it's easy for us to neglect prayer—to let it get crowded out by all the other things that demand our attention at work, at

school, or at home. To help us be more intentional in our lives of prayer, our Natural Church Development core team has established a **Prayer of the Week**, and is calling all members of Gloria Dei to pray the Prayer of the Week together at 9:00 AM each day. If you can't pray some day at 9:00 AM, you can choose an alternate time, or if you forget, you can still know that the rest of your brothers and sisters in Christ have been praying with you and for you.

The Sundays after Epiphany are a traditional time to emphasize sharing the Gospel with those who haven't heard the good news of Jesus Christ. Our January prayers are inspired by that emphasis.

The following prayers will be used for the Sundays indicated and for the week following:

(Jan. 1) Lord God of our salvation, it is your will that all people might come to you through your Son Jesus Christ. Inspire our witness to him, that all may know the power of his forgiveness and the hope of his resurrection. We pray in his name. Amen

(Jan. 8) O God, you created all people in your image. We thank you for the astonishing variety of races and cultures in this world. Enrich our lives by ever-widening circles of fellowship, and show us your presence in those who differ most from us, until our knowledge of your love is made perfect in our love for all your children; though your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

(Jan. 15) Merciful Father, your kindness caused the light of the Gospel to shine among us. Extend your mercy now, we pray, to all the people of the world who do not have hope in Jesus Christ, that your salvation may be made known to them also and that all hearts would turn to you; through the same Jesus Christ, your Son our Lord. Amen

(Jan. 22) O God, increase the faith and energy of your Church to desire and work for the salvation of all people, that they might be freed from sin and that hope be renewed in many hearts, to the increase of the kingdom of Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

(Jan. 29) Lord Jesus, you stretched out your arms of love on the hard wood of the cross, that all nations might come within the reach of your saving embrace: Clothe us in your Spirit, that we, stretching forth our hands in loving concern for others, may bring those who do not know You to your knowledge and love; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. NEW ECONOMY. *The Lutheran's* January issue focuses on "Economic disruption and an evolving church." An ELCA pastor writes about the economic impact of her layoff on the ELCA. She suggests that hard times—job losses, housing insecurity, and decreases in investment and retirement income—are pulling the church to look at new ways to consider its work. A study guide is available for this article (and for more than 300 others) at www.thelutheran.org.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE. *The Lutheran* is a resource for your congregation and members. In the January issue: learn how to have fun in worship with a Dr. Seuss liturgy ... go green with Lutheran social service agencies ... get some parental advice on saying sorry to your kids ... find out how parents can keep things quiet during worship ... read a review of *Happy Feet Two* and the children's book *One Love* ... meet the kids who bought a boat for Juan, a fisherman in El Salvador ... and learn about a study that says sabbaticals score big for pastors.

In *The Lutheran's* January issue: get a report on the ELCA Church Council's November meeting ... travel to the Middle East, where a Palestinian Lutheran is bringing in tourists ... visit Washington, where pastors urge believers out of their homes and into two new churches ... find a "common word" in Virginia, where a dialogue involves Lutherans and Muslims ... see what the ELCA Board of Pensions is calling itself now ... and get news from the ELCA's colleges, universities and seminaries.

News & Notes from Gloria Dei Library

RECENT ADDITIONS TO THE LIBRARY COLLECTION

In *The Time of Our Lives: A Conversation About America; Who We Are, Where We've Been, and Where We Need to Go Now, to Recapture the American Dream* (973.92 BRO), author and broadcast journalist Tom Brokaw discusses America's past, present, and future. Brokaw addresses themes familiar to readers of his other works, e.g., that the United States is an immigrant nation, that Americans need to learn more science and math to compete, and that Americans also need to embrace thrifter habits and volunteer for public service. He harkens back continually to the values instilled in him growing up in South Dakota in the '50s. He includes telling vignettes about people who have coped with deprivation and adversity to achieve great things. Each chapter sounds a nostalgic theme: "Stepping Up and Signing Up" or "Balancing the Book of Life" to assert how best to tap into the themes that made America great. This conversation starter is an upbeat message from a veteran journalist. *Time of Our Lives* was purchased with monies from the Irene Jacobs Memorial Fund.

Added to our collection of music CD's is a five disc set entitled *Beethoven Collection* (CD 784.2 BEE), which includes Symphonies Numbers 1- 9 with the Hungarian Philharmonic Orchestra. This collection of orchestral music is a gift from a Gloria Dei member.

Two remastered DVD's were also added to the collection in December: *A Charlie Brown Christmas* and *The Lion King*.



CHURCH COUNCIL

December 19, 2011 Minutes

Members Present: Brandon Parks, Jana Abbott, Phil Seemann, Mick Haugen, Earl Buck, Barrett Ellis, Julie Koehler, Jay York, Pastor Jacobson, Joan Pritchard, Karen Pleming, and staff member Cathy Latta. **Members Absent:** Valarie Magaña and Tom Yingling

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Brandon Parks. Correspondence from the ELCA Board of Pensions, Sisters of St. Joseph, and Rainbow Trail Lutheran Camp was circulated. Minutes of the November 21, 2011 meeting were approved as presented. The Treasurer's Report was approved. Actual year to date income is short of budget by \$5,235.

Pastor's written report was approved. Pastor's request that \$6,000 of his 2012 salary be diverted pre-tax into the ELCA pension plan was approved.

Committee and Staff Reports:

1. Finance Committee's written report was approved.
2. Property Committee's report was approved. Jay also reported that there was a leak under the sink of the women's restroom. Stover's Restoration invoice has been received and is around \$4,500. Our insurance deductible is \$1,000.
3. Worship and Music Committee report was approved. The Worship and Music Committee volunteered to reduce the music budget request by \$400.
4. Christian Education written report was approved.
5. Youth Committee: Written report included minutes from the November and December meetings. A request to hold three fundraisers was approved. Sara Guild's Annual Soup Luncheon will be held January 29, 2012 and the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner will be February 21st. Both of those fundraisers will benefit youth trips. Souper Bowl Sunday for an as yet to be determined charity was also approved.
6. Social Ministry/Outreach Committee: Written report was approved.
7. Stewardship Report: Barrett gave an update on the stewardship campaign.
8. Women's Ministry: No report. The Committee did not meet in December.
9. Staff Reports: Annette Lindal's written report was accepted.
10. Executive Committee: Communication included setting the agenda for this meeting and arrangements for the Council Christmas party.

Old Business:

1. Proposed changes to the Personnel Policy as drafted by Jana Abbott were reviewed. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the policy with the following changes on page 10, #1 and #2:

2. The funeral luncheon brochure was reviewed and changes recommended. Cathy will incorporate suggested changes for Council's review in January.

2. Motion made, seconded and approved to create an Anniversary Celebration Committee. Jana Abbott was appointed to the committee as Council Representative.
3. Changed the January Church Council meeting date to January 9, 2012 at 7:00 PM.
4. Approved the agenda for the annual meeting.
5. Committee reports are past due and should be submitted electronically to the office no later than Jan. 3rd.
6. Reviewed the budget timeline. Proposed budget will be available on January 15, information meeting held on January 22nd, and the annual meeting on January 29.

Council entered in to executive session at 8:20 to discuss the proposed 2012 budget. Exited executive session at 9:00 PM.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05 PM following The Lord's Prayer.

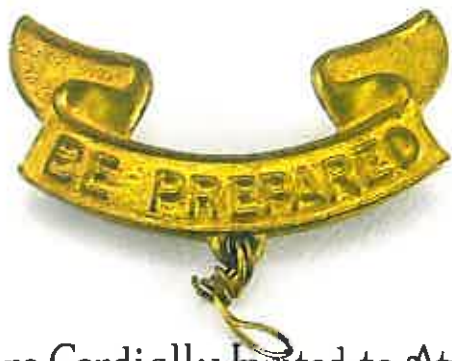
