

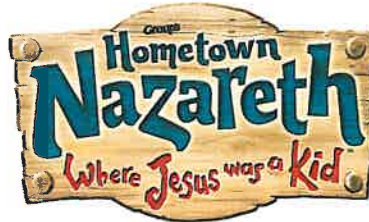

July Prayer of the Week



One of the ways we live out our Christian faith is through a life of prayer. Sometimes, however, it's easy for us to neglect prayer—to let it get crowded out by all the other things that demand our attention at work, at school, or at home. To help us be more intentional in our lives of prayer, our Natural Church Development core team has established a **Prayer of the Week**, and is calling all members of Gloria Dei to pray the *Prayer of the Week together at 9:00 AM each day*. If you can't pray some day at 9:00 AM, you can choose an alternate time, or if you forget, you can still know that the rest of your brothers and sisters in Christ have been praying with you and for you.

This summer, our prayers reflect general themes of faith and discipleship as we move through Ordinary Time in the season after Pentecost.

The following prayers will be used for the Sundays indicated and for the week following:

(July 3) Lord of all nations, we give thanks for the freedom and prosperity of our land, help us to be good stewards of those gifts and to use them for the benefit of others. In Jesus name, we pray. Amen

(July 10) Almighty God, grant us a steadfast faith in Jesus, a cheerful hope in your mercy, and a sincere love for you and one another. Amen

(July 17) Father, creator of unfailing light, give that same light to all who call upon you. May our lips praise you, our lives proclaim your goodness, our works give you honor, and our voices celebrate you forever. Amen

(July 24) O God, you have put your own eternity in our hearts, and have made us to hunger and thirst after you. Satisfy the need which you have implanted in us, that we may find you in life, and find life in you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

(July 31) God, our creator, you have ordered seedtime and harvest, sunshine and rain. Grant that all the people of our nation may give thanks to you for food, drink, and all that sustains life; may honor the land and water from which these good things come; and may respect those who labor to product them; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

MISSION TRIP UPDATE:

For those of you who haven't heard, our summer mission trip has had a couple of changes. First, we will no longer be going to the Twin Cities in Minnesota but rather to Joplin, Missouri to help out the tornado victims. Second, due to Sara's good fortune in getting a full time job in Hays, Kansas, she will not be able to go on this trip and has handed it all over to me (Kelly)! Needless to say I am VERY excited about our opportunity to make a difference and really be the hands and feet of Christ in the tornado ravaged community of Joplin.

There are still some details to be ironed out, but at this time here are our current plans:

Depart on Sunday July 31st after service. We will be staying at Abundant Life Christian Center in Joplin where they will provide cots/bunks, showers and 3 meals daily for us. More than likely we will be working in their distribution center sorting and distributing donations to those in need. In addition, we may be involved in debris removal and or light construction. Plan to work Monday through Thursday afternoon at which time we will depart for Kansas City so that we can spend the day at Worlds of Fun on Friday. On Saturday morning August 6th after breakfast we will return to Wichita.

I will have a parents' meeting after church on Sunday July 3rd to answer any questions and give you more details on costs, etc. If you are unable to attend please let me know.

Please Note: everyone who participates on this mission trip needs to have an up-to-date tetanus shot.

The Sanctuary Lamp

What is the purpose and significance of the sanctuary lamp (eternal light)?

In describing the construction of the Temple, Exodus 27:20-21 prescribes that a light should burn continually before "the tent of the meeting, outside the curtain, that is before the covenant." This perpetually-burning light symbolized the continuing presence of God with his people.

Many Lutheran congregations have sanctuary lamps in which candles burn continuously throughout the week. When we come into the Church and see the lamp burning, we remember that Christ "the light of the world" is always with his people, especially at the altar in the Holy Eucharist. The Church then is never an empty place; because it is a holy place where God comes to us in Word and Sacrament. As the Psalmist says: "O Lord, I love the house in which you dwell, and the place where your glory abides. (28:8)."

In churches which utilize a tabernacle for the consecrated Eucharistic elements, it is especially appropriate for the light to burn in proximity to the tabernacle, emphasizing the real presence of Christ in the sacrament.

READING

SPEAKING CHRISTIAN: Why Christian Words have Lost Their Meaning and Power – And How They Can Be Restored (248 BOR) is written by Marcus J. Borg, a much-published author and Canon Theologian at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Portland, Oregon. He is a member of the Jesus Seminar and the Society of Biblical Literature and here makes an argument for a contextual reading of the words and experience of the New Testament. He divides his book into twenty-five chapters using various thematic chapters with common words, terms and events, such as Jesus, Easter, Sin, Pentecost, etc. To Borg, we face a choice between a faith mesmerized by our fate in the next world and a faith that focuses on the transformation of this world. One of Borg's books, *Meeting Jesus Again for the First Time*, was discussed by the class facilitated by Jack Jones several years ago.

A Sick Day for Amos McGee (JF E STE) by Phillip C. Stead and illustrated by Erin Stead is recommended for children from preschool through grade two. It is the story of zookeeper Amos McGee who always makes time to visit his good friends, the various animals at the zoo. After Amos gets a cold, his friends miss him and go to his place to care for him and cheer him up. This book is a quiet tale of good deeds rewarded and underscores the bonds of friendship and loyalty. The familiar pet-bonding theme will have great appeal, especially in the final images of the wild creatures snuggled up with Amos in his cozy home. Funds from the Edna Stevens Memorial were used to purchase this book.

A thank you to Pastor Jacobson for the gift of **An Illustrated History of the Church: The Great Challenges** (270 BED) by Guy Bedouelle to the Gloria Dei Library. The author is a professor of church history in the School of Theology at the University of Fribourg in Switzerland and has published a number of books on church history and humanism. The present book is a history of the role of Christianity through the centuries and provides a multidimensional look at the church from early Christian times to the present day. Numerous high-quality reproductions allow one to see the architecture, sculpture, pictorial and decorative art of each period and are designed to lead one to an understanding and appreciation of the role of the church and art in human events. This book is for anyone who appreciates great art and stimulating history and who wants to understand the role of religion in history and in society.

Members Present: Brandon Parks, Jana Abbott, Karen Pleming, Tom Yingling, Mick Haugen, Barrett Ellis, Joan Pritchard, Earl Buck, Phil Seemann, Julie Koehler, Valarie Magana, Pastor Peter Jacobson, and staff member Cathy Latta.

The meeting was called to order by President Brandon Parks. Pastor Jacobson led devotions and opening prayer. An acknowledgement for Gloria Dei's gift to the ELCA Disaster Response designated for the Pacific Earthquake and Tsunami was circulated. Minutes of the May 16, 2011 meeting were approved as presented.

The Treasurer's Report was approved. We had a \$10,000 negative variance for May. Cash deficit for May was \$3,266.

Committee and Staff Reports:

1. Pastor's written report was accepted. Motion was made, seconded, and unanimously approved to move the July council meeting to July 11th due to VBS requiring council meeting space on July 18th.
2. Finance Committee did not meet in May. The next scheduled meeting will be August 8th.
3. Property Committee written report accepted. Discussion was held on the kitchen stove. The plan is to keep the stove, make it operable, and provide training. New igniters have been ordered.
4. Worship and Music Committee did not meet in May. Next scheduled meeting will be in August.
5. Christian Education: No report.
6. Youth Committee report was accepted.
7. Social Ministry/Outreach written report was accepted.
8. Stewardship Committee: No report.
9. Women's Ministry did not meet in May and will not meet through the summer.
10. Staff reports were accepted from the Youth Director and Director of Music and Christian Education.
11. Joan reported that the Executive Committee communicated on the following issues: bid approval for exterior window replacement by Hopper Glass, a personnel issue, and to set the agenda for this meeting.

Old Business:

Capital Campaign update: Deposit has been made on the stained glass windows. Carpet committee has made the carpet selection. Hopper Glass will require ten weeks to fabricate windows after measurements have been taken.

Motion was made, seconded, and unanimously approved to hire Kelsey Proffitt and Petra Jacobson as Nursery Attendants to replace Kristian and Rachel. They will be required to obtain Red Cross certification. Both Kelsey and Petra have volunteered in the nursery. Council will solicit alternate youth to volunteer in the nursery to gain experience and be successors of Petra and Kelsey.

New Business:

Motion was made, seconded, and unanimously passed to approve the Social Ministry/Outreach Committee's request to perform a Melodrama in the fall. They wish to involve other churches and the Riverside neighborhood to raise funds to benefit relief efforts for the Japanese Tsunami and Joplin Tornado.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to create a search committee for Sara's replacement. Julie Koehler will chair the committee and try to recruit those who served on the most recent search committee. Pastor reported on the job opening postings that have been made at the area colleges and universities.

Church Council moved and adopted the following Resolution: The Gloria Dei Church Council wishes to acknowledge their appreciation for Sara Humburg's dedication, leadership, and outstanding service to the youth of Gloria Dei. Sara will be deeply missed.

Pastor will recognize Sara with a send off at worship service on Sunday, June 26. A reception honoring and thanking Sara will be held after the worship service.

Discussion was held on an inquiry by the Riverside Citizen Association into using the grassy area between the church parking lot and the castle for a community garden. Cathy will notify the RCA president, Melissa Alley, that the request was denied.

The meeting adjourned at 8:22 PM after the Lord's Prayer.

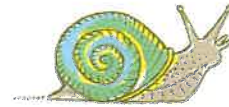
