About Being Lutheran

How Did I Get to be 70 When I'm 35 Inside?: Spiritual Surprises of Later Life (248.5 DOU) by Linda Douty discusses the challenges and surprises of aging by talking about how you actually feel, not what you're supposed to feel. Douty, a speaker on topics of aging, personal growth and spiritual formation is the author of two other "How Can I" series. In this her third entry of the series she interviewed more than fifty elders ages seventy through ninety-nine by asking about self-discovery, outside versus inside age, and the changing image of God. 'Surprise,' is the operative word in the interviews and defines Douty's eight chapters. To be open to surprise is to grow and to nurture souls and skills. This is not a how-to book: it is about ways older people have plowed through pain, the physical and spiritual, toward wisdom, while appreciating a deepening spirituality that comes with advancing years. *How Did I Get to be 70...* was reviewed and recommended in the September issue of *The Lutheran* which has a monthly column of book reviews entitled 'Best this month.' Be sure to check it out next month. This book is a gift from a Gloria Dei reader.

William Allen White award winning author Patricia Reilly Giff's book ***Eleven*** (JF INT GIF) is a story of self-discovery. A secret search for hidden birthday presents leads almost-eleven Sam to the attic where he finds a newspaper photo of himself, age three, captioned 'Missing' and with a different last name. This discovery causes him to wonder about his true identity. Learning the truth requires research and Sam solicits help from Caroline, a new girl at school. While solving the mystery of Sam's past, they form a solid friendship. This story examines friendship, family secrets and the struggles of Sam, a learning-disabled child, trying to make sense of the world. Giff crafts an affecting story of two characters, needy in different ways, who find understanding through their friendship. *Eleven* was purchased with funds from the Edna Steven's Memorial Fund and is recommended for grades three through five.

Two DVD's were added to the library to replace old format video tapes: ***Toy Story*** (DVD JF TOY) which was purchased with funds from the Edna Stevens Memorial Fund and ***To Kill a Mockingbird*** (DVD F TOK) which was purchased with funds from the Vi Tidemann Memorial Fund.

The Saints

What is a Saint?

Derived from the Latin **sanctus**, the word "saint" means "holy." As such saints are holy ones, those who have been chosen by God and set apart for a divine purpose. In a broad sense all Christians are saints because all Christians have been chosen by God, marked by the Cross of Christ in Holy Baptism, and set apart to bear witness in the world to God's grace. In a narrow sense the saints are Christians whom the church has designated as exemplary models of the Christian life, notably the apostles.

The **Augsburg Confession** states, "*It is also taught among us that saints should be kept in remembrance so that our faith may be strengthened when we see what grace they received and how they were sustained by faith.*" We thank God for the saints' examples, let their examples strengthen us, and seek to imitate those examples as best we can.

One way that we remember the saints is by observing saint's days and commemorations. A saint's day is usually the day that the saint died, often by being martyred, and entering into eternal life. The **Lutheran Book of Worship** contains an extensive list of commemorations of significant persons in church history, from Martin Luther to Martin Luther King Jr., from Augustine to John XXIII.

Some saints' days may be observed when they occur on any Sunday in the seasons after Pentecost or Epiphany. The hymns, prayer of the day, readings, and sermon would reflect the person's life. Saints' days and commemorations provide an appropriate theme for weekday celebrations. A special celebration may be planned to remember a person of particular local, ethnic, or historical interest. Observing the saints' days and commemorations enriches the liturgical year as it enriches our spiritual lives.

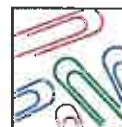

CHURCH COUNCIL

Minutes of the October 17, 2011 Meeting

Members Present: Brandon Parks, Jana Abbott, Phil Seemann, Tom Yingling, Mick Haugen, Earl Buck, Barrett Ellis, Julie Koehler, Valarie Magaña, Jay York, Pastor Jacobson, and staff member Cathy Latta.

Members Absent: Joan Pritchard and Karen Fleming

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Brandon Parks. Correspondence: acknowledgement from InterFaith Ministries and a request for support from Shepherd Center West that was forwarded on to the Social Ministry Committee for their consideration.

Minutes of the September 19, 2011 meeting were approved as presented.

The Treasurer's Report was approved. September receipts fell short of budget expectations by \$7,000. Year to date actual income is approximately \$5,000 short of what was budgeted.

Pastor's written report was approved.

Committee and Staff Reports:

1. Finance Committee's written report was approved. The Committee met with the Church Mutual agent for the annual review of coverage. Additional coverage may be added at renewal.
2. Property Committee's report was approved. Carpet has been installed to cover damaged terrazzo in the Chancel. The water heater is out in the flower sacristy and will be replaced soon. Mike Florio has volunteered to stripe the parking lot. Five Star has notified Jay of a 10% price increase, which will be reflected in the 2012 budget. Weeding is needed around the tree donated in memory of the Walls.
3. Worship and Music Committee report was approved. The Committee recommends replacing the aisle candelabras with ones that would be attached to the pews. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the purchase of 12 aisle torches with candles and glass chimneys at a cost of \$3,832.20 plus shipping to be funded with Memorial Funds.
4. Christian Education written report was accepted.
5. Youth Committee's written report was accepted. Council approved three requests for Youth Fundraisers; Chili Cook-off, Poinsettia Sale, and Basket auction to be held at the Advent Dinner.
6. Outreach Committee: written report was accepted. The Committee does not want to send out an inactive letter. They have been making phone calls to inactive members. The Outreach Committee would like to review inactive members more frequently than annually.
7. Stewardship Report: Council was provided a copy of the 2012 Stewardship Campaign letter and a copy of the Time and Talent survey that will be sent with the letter.
8. Women's Ministry: No report. The Committee did not meet in October.
9. Staff Reports: Annette Lindal's written report was accepted.
10. Executive Committee: The only discussion was to set the agenda for this meeting.

Old Business:

1. Nothing new to discuss on the Capital Campaign.
2. Julie Koehler advised that there has been no progress in the search for a Youth Coordinator. After discussion, it was decided that an ad would be placed on Craigslist, posted on the Gloria Dei website and on our Facebook page. Cathy will also send out to the Shelby church network through LinkedIn.
3. The Funeral Study Committee presented a report and recommendation. No action was taken until more information is gathered and the proposed changes can be discussed with Joan Pritchard.
4. Jana Abbott presented a draft of suggested changes to the Personnel Policy. Council members were asked to review the proposed changes and be ready to discuss at the next meeting.
5. Mick Haugen presented a revised proposal for server and work station upgrades. Following discussion a motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved to proceed with the proposed update to hardware and software. The updates will be funded out of Reserve for Replacement of Church Property.

The meeting adjourned at 8:55 PM following The Lord's Prayer.
